Tom Daniel was privileged to be the treating veterinarian for the USA 4-In Hand team at the 2000 WEG. He also has been the treating veterinarian at the Carolina International CIC and at the Stoneybrook Steeplechase for the past 25 years.
- A strong relationship with NC State Veterinary Hospital which is a one hour trailer ride away. They have an excellent team of specialists who will be available to you if needed.
- The transitory nature of some clientele allows us vast experience working cooperatively with other treating veterinarians to produce a team approach to the horses care. At times, that means we attend to the horse and communicate with the primary veterinarian. Other times it is simply allowing them access to our facility and/or equipment and we are not directly involved in the diagnostics. We have the latest technology with digital radiology, digital ultrasound, video endoscopy (upper airway and gastroscopy) and nuclear scintigraphy (bone scan). There is both a CT and MRI at NC State Veterinary Hospital.
- A cooperative relationship with a board certified radiologist who has state of the art equipment and vast expertise to perform your ultrasounds and is available for interpretations of any imaging. She is in private practice and will attend to the horses at their boarding location.
